

"DO NOT BE AFRAID . . ."

During his inaugural address, President Franklin D. Roosevelt tried to calm and comfort a troubled nation by assuring them that ". . . THE ONLY THING WE HAVE TO FEAR IS FEAR ITSELF." Be that as it may, most of us would readily admit to being afraid of something. It may be as simple as having a phobia for insects, or as complicated as being haunted by a fear of growing old or dying. Fear may be defined as being an emotional response to perceived threats, and we certainly understand that emotions are sometimes difficult to keep in check. If controlled, fear can be an invaluable tool in building a strong character. The real danger to our well-being, however, lies in worries and anxieties that are allowed to consume us.

We must make every effort to **REPLACE OUR FEARS WITH FAITH**, and not permit despair to overcome us. How many times in the Gospels do we find our Lord instructing His followers not to be afraid? How often does He tell them not to worry: that their Father in heaven will take care of them? How can we ever forget His admonition: "Which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature?" (Matthew 6:27)

Our faith can be of tremendous help in eliminating undue fear. In the Psalms, we are repeatedly told to **"TRUST IN THE LORD."** Throughout both Testaments, we find numerous examples of people who blindly placed their lives in God's hands, and were ultimately blessed for doing so. Those who are able to "commend their lives to Christ", as we are asked to do at every Divine Liturgy, will find themselves free from the tensions that can do irreparable damage to our souls.

For the Devout Man Mode 1

As a citizen of the desert and an angel incarnate and a wonder-worker you shone forth, O Makarios our God-bearing father. Since you received the spiritual gifts by fasting and vigilance and prayer, you can cure those who are ailing and heal the souls of those who run to you with faith. Glory to Him who gave His might to you; glory to Him who placed a crown on you; glory to Him who operates through you, providing cures to all.

Colossians 3:4-11

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Epistle

The reading is from Paul’s Letter to the Colossians

Brethren, when Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience. In these you once walked, when you lived in them. But now put them all away; anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old nature with its practices and have put on the new nature, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all.

January 19, 2025 Prayer of the Gospel

Luke 17:12-19

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Gospel

The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.

At that time, as Jesus entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said: “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.” When he saw them he said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus’s feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then said Jesus: “Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?” And he said to him: “Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.”
